Harry White Memorial 3 Gun Match

This is an innovative match requiring a Rimfire pistol, Rimfire rifle, and a Centerfire rifle.

Fee: \$5.00

Ammo: 40 rounds Rimfire, 10 rounds Centerfire

Target: Harry White 1 ½ inch circle with a ¼ inch dot in the center. Twenty circles per target for Match 1 and 2. Ten circles for Match 3.

Scoring:

Touching the Red Dot is an X worth 10 points

White area inside circle 7 points

Touching or cutting the black circle 3 points

Outside the black circle 0 points

Lowest score will be used for multiple hits in any scoring area.

Time Limit: Each match will be 20 minutes

Match 1: Any Rimfire pistol, 6X max scope or iron sights, to be fired at 25 yards. 20 rounds, one per circle.

Match 2: Any rimfire rifle meeting Sporter Class rules (per Scoped Rimfire at 50 yards) to be fired at 50 yards, 20 rounds, one per circle

Match 3: Any Centerfire, varmint or hunting class, no benchrest class rifles. Any power scope, to be fired at 100 yards. 10 rounds , one per circle.

Rests: Sandbags must be used

Front Rest may be Hoppies, Hart Sinclair, Etc, with sandbag touching stock

Rear: Sandbag touching the stock

200 YARD CENTERFIRE VARMINT MATCH

Any Centerfire Varmint rifle with a working safety. Custom barrels will be allowed. Any scope scope allowed.

Entry fee \$5.00. Match will be 20 rounds per competitor, plus sighting shots.

Sleeved actions, custom actions, and stocks designed specifically for benchrest competition will not be allowed.

Stock cannot exceed 2 1/2 inches at it widest point and must be convex where it contacts front and rear sand bags.

Targets: Competitors will be firing at a prairie dog, (varmint target) with a scoring circle. All targets will be posted at 200 yards. 5 rounds per target, four targets per shooter with a 15 minute time limit per target. When more than 5 rounds are fired into a target, the lowest value will be recorded .

Scoring: Touching Center Dot is an X worth 10 points.

Inside the Black Circle, 6 points.

Touching Black Circle, 3 points.

Balance of White Varmint, 1 point.

Maximum score per target, 50 points, 5X. Maximum score per match, 200 points, 20X.

Rests: Sand bags must be used.

Front: May be Hoppies, Sinclair, Hart Etc., with sand bag touching the stock.

Rear: Sand bag touching the stock.

PISTOL BOWLING PIN MATCH

Entry Fee is \$1 per pistol class

The classes with the number of pins for each class:

22 semi auto - 5 pins

22 single action - 4 pins

22 double action - 5 pins

38/357 mag - 5 pins

9mm - 7 pins

44 mag - 5 pins

45 acp - 5 pins

center fire single action - 4 pins

pocket auto - 3 pins

pocket revolver - 3 pins

The objective is to knock all of the pins off of the table or sawhorses.

Each class is scored by time.

You will have up to 20 seconds to clear all of the pins.

If all pins are not cleared it will be a no score.

The front legs of the tables and sawhorses will be set at 25 feet from where the shooters will stand.

There will be 4 rounds of shooting in each class with a time for each round.

The slowest time for each shooter will be cut and the three best will be used to get the average.

67 GUN CLUB 900 BULLSEYE MATCHES

The 67 Gun Club has three 900 Bullseye Matches a year. These club level matches are an excellent tune-up for advanced shooters or a good starting point for those new to pistol competition.

Both the equipment and course of fire are simple but that's not to say that it's easy to shoot well. Any 22 L.R. revolver or semi-auto with a 5-shot capacity will work and sights can be iron, scope, or red dot. Firing is done one handed, unsupported.

67 GUN CLUB COWBOY MATCHES

Cowboy matches at the 67 Gun Club are intended to introduce member to SASS type cowboy matches. SASS rules and safety procedures are used but with minor modifications intended to help new shooters get started.

Fire arms used include 2 single action revolvers (with holsters), a pistol caliber lever action rifle, and a double barrel shotgun. Only low velocity lead ammo is allowed as targets are close range metal plates.

Four or five stages are shot per match.

Cowboy attire is always welcome but not required at these matches.

ALL CLUB AND NRA SAFETY RULES WILL BE IN EFFECT FOR THESE MATCHES.

100 YARD HUNTER RIFLE MATCH

Any Centerfire Hunting Rifle .243-6MM minimum caliber with scope. Maximum scope power 6X, (variable scopes will be taped.) Entry fee \$5.00. Match will be 20 rounds per competitor, plus sighting shots.

Target: Official 100 Yard Hunter Class Rifle Target. (5 Targets, plus sighter target per sheet.)
One shot per each scoring target on the target sheet. (5 shots maximum per sheet on scoring targets.
Unlimited rounds on the sighter target.) Competitors will be given 15 minutes per target sheet.

Scoring: Each bullseye has a value of 6 to 10 points plus an X.
Two or more shots on a record bullseye, the lowest scoring shot will be recorded.
Possible points per target sheet, 50 points, 5X.
Possible points per match, 200 points, 20X. (Competitors will use 4 target sheets.)

Rests: Sand bags must be used.
Front: May be Hoppies, Sinclair, Hart. Etc., with sand bag contacting rifle stock.
Rear: Sand bag touching the stock.

Scoped Rimfire at 50 yards

Fee: \$5.00

Target: RBA 50yd target, consisting of 25 target blocks plus sighters.

Scoring:

Each target block is worth 10 points

The innermost ring counts 10 points

Next ring is 9 points and each succeeding ring 1 point less

If a bullet touches a line or x shooter receives the highest point (best edge scoring)

If a shot is within the target box but outside the largest ring, score is 4

If more than one shot appears in target square, shooter receives lowest score minus 1

A perfect score would be 250 25x

A match will consist of 3 targets, for a possible score of 750-75x

Time limit:

20 minutes for 25 rounds.

Sporter Class Rifle:

Any factory rimfire rifle (22, 22Mag, 17 HMR, or 17 Mach 2)

Any sporter or varmint weight barrel allowed. (non-OEM barrels will be allowed)

Stock width cannot exceed 2 ¼ inches at it's widest point.

Forearm and buttstock that come in contact with front and rear sandbags must be convex

Rifle must have a working safety.

Tuners not allowed

Scope:

12X maximum. (Variable scopes will be taped.)

Rest:

Sandbags must be used

Front rest may be Hoppies, Hart, Sinclair, Etc, with sandbags touching stock

Rear, sandbag touching stock

2. Keep your Finger off the Trigger, Except When Shooting.
3. Keep the Action Open and The firearm Unloaded, Except When Shooting.
4. Know Your Firearm and Ammunition.
5. Be Sure of Your Target – and What’s Beyond.
6. Know Where Others Are at All Times.
7. Wear Ear and Eye Protection.
8. Know and Obey All Range Commands.
9. Don’t Mix Alcohol and Drugs With Shooting.
10. Treat Every Gun as a Loaded Gun.
11. Discharge Firearms in a Down Range Direction Only. (Never Fire Across the Range, to the Right or Left.)
12. Members are Allowed (2) Two Shooting Guests. (Members are Responsible for their Guests.)
13. Shooters are to Remove Targets and Litter From the Range.
14. No Bottles or Glass Material is to be Used as a Target.
15. No Rifles or Shotguns are to be Used on the Pistol Range.
16. Lock Gate Upon Entering and Leaving the Range.
17. The Range is Open from Dawn to Dusk.
